The College Park Cavaliers (14-10) scored 21 of the game's first 26 points in a 28-point homecourt rout of South Houston Saturday.

Adam Rowe's 17 points led the Cavs in the 72-44 victory. Garrett Constance also filled up the stat sheet with 14 points, five rebounds, seven steals and five assists.

"We jumped on them pretty good in the beginning and never let up," College Park assistant coach David Victorick said. "The team played really well."

The Cavs outscored South Houston 16-8 in the second and 23-16 in the third in a game was never in doubt.

"We played great through the first three quarters and kind of coasted through the fourth," Victorick said.

"We really didn't have our legs early," John Cooper coach Mike Cooper said. "But in the fourth quarter we put on a full-court press and the kids really showed a lot of heart to come back."
