### College Park extends win streak to four; basketball roundup

The College Park Cavaliers found their shooting touch in the fourth quarter and pulled away from Katy Taylor for a 52-43 victory at home Monday night.

Now 15-10 on the season, the Cavs notched their fourth win in a row by hitting six of 10 field goal attempts down the stretch.

After trailing by nine points after the first quarter, the visiting Mustangs (3-13) whittled College Park's lead down to 35-34 entering the final period. But Adam Rowe, Garrett Constance and Eddie Porter contributed four points apiece in the fourth.

"We hit a wall," said College Park assistant coach David Victorick. "We'd been through a run of games during the holiday without a practice and we played flat."

Stafford Whittington nailed a three-point basket and point guard J.P. Wells hit a couple of free throws in the closing minute to pad the Cavs' margin.

Rowe, Constance and Porter finished the night with 12 points each.

Constance hauled down seven rebounds and dished out four assists. Wells came up with five steals, while 6-foot-10 junior Sam Ryan grabbed seven boards.

The Cavaliers' next game is Jan. 13 at Houston Kinkaid.

#### Oak Ridge loses

The War Eagles (13-6) committed 11 of their 22 turnovers in the first quarter of a 69-55 loss at Katy Seven Lakes (17-5) Monday night.

"From the middle of the second quarter on we held our own against them," Oak Ridge coach Rob Stewart said.

The War Eagles were without leading scorer Logan Griffin, who was sidelined with a stomach virus. Picking up the slack were Alonzo Jefferson, who finished with 11 points, and Scott Bastian and Robert Tyson, who added 10 apiece.

Tyson scored all of his points in the War Eagles' 24-point fourth quarter.

Oak Ridge hosts Katy at 2 p.m. Saturday.

#### Lady Cavs drop to fourth in TABC poll

The College Park Lady Cavaliers slipped to fourth place in the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches' Class 5A girls rankings, the TABC announced Monday.

The Lady Cavs (20-2) are coming off a 67-53 loss to Waco Midway in the championship game of the M.T. Rice Holiday Classic. Waco Midway went into the game ranked No. 7 in Class 4A, and climbed to fourth after the win.

Meanwhile, The Woodlands Christian Academy boys remain No. 1 in the TABC's small private schools rankings.
